



Student Arrival Time



Many students are arriving at school too early and they are therefore not supervised on the playground.

Students are not permitted to arrive at school until **8:40am.** This allows the teacher on duty time to set up the crossing, unlock the toilets and scan the playground for any potential issues. Please be aware of what time your children are arriving at school and make necessary adjustments.

Uniform

Many of you may be aware that Grace's Uniforms has been taken over by Gwyny and the shop is now named 'All Pressed Up'. The school is in regular contact with Gwyny to ensure that there are adequate supplies of uniform so we are aware of any possible delays. Gwyny has an adequate supply of uniform for all of your uniform needs and should a larger or smaller size be required, Gwyny is more than happy to access the required size as a special order. Gwyny also offers an alteration service so uniforms are able to be tailored to fit any student. The school continues to sell the tracksuit, hats and t-shirts.

Executive staff members will monitor uniform to ensure that all students are in the correct uniform according to our uniform policy, including hair styles, shoes, socks, jewellery and hair ties. Students will get a reminder note, and if the uniform concern is not addressed within a week, a phone call will be made to parents/carers. If at any time students are out of uniform, it is expected that a note would be sent into school to explain the situation and efforts be made to rectify the situation as soon as possible. Annual Improvement Plan
