













# Binnaway Junior Judging Day

#### **Good Start!**

We have noticed a few of our students are experiencing some difficulties in settling back into school routines after the holidays. This may be happening every day or just occasionally. We all know as adults that we have good days and bad days and find it hard to adapt to routines again, so our little people are no different, especially when the weather is hot! Here are a few tips on how to make the mornings run smoother.

#### Strategies for helping students who are having difficulties going to school

- Ensure children have adequate sleep, healthy lunch box, breakfast and water.
- Get someone else to drop your child at school, if you can or have them catch the bus. Children often cope better with separation at home rather than at the school gate.
- Make seperation at the gate clear eg. goodbye, I love you have a good day and leave don't linger.
- Praise your child for being brave and going to school.
- Consider rewarding them. For example, if your child goes to school bravely all week, reward them with a special outing with a parent to their favourite park, or their favourite meal for dinner.
- If a problem persists, seek support from school staff who are more than happy to walk your child into their classroom.

Awards ranged from picking up rubbish in the playground WITHOUT being asked, to great work with odds and even numbers, to displaying the skills of a respectful learner. # It is crucial that every family participate to support your child's learning

At St Lawrence's Catholic Primary School, we aim to empower our students as learners to take increasing responsibility and ownership for their learning so they can develop into independent life-long learners.

At St Lawrence's we want our students to develop a 'growth mind-set', that is, that their learning is not fixed and that they have the 'power' to take charge of their learning, never give up and achieve the goals that they set for themselves.

A 'Student-Centred Conference' focuses on the child and is a way of encouraging students to take responsibility for their own learning, actions and decisions. It also demonstrates that, together, we will support their learning and celebrate their achievements.

#### Roles and Responsibilities

#### Students:

★ Students plan and prepare their work for discussion with the support of their teacher. During the conference students demonstrate their learning goals with evidence of their learning. This enables students to share their work in a confident and articulate manner.

#### Parents/Carers:

★ Parents/carers are expected to attend the conference with their child. Parents can offer support, encouragement, be active listeners and praise their efforts.

#### Teachers:

★ Teachers support students to develop their confidence to share their work and understandings effectively.

They play a crucial role in supporting students to plan and prepare the work they choose to present as evidence of their learning. Teachers support students in selecting effective presentation skills. Teachers will also assist with other information for parents/carers regarding their child's learning.

The conference will take strictly 15 minutes. If more time is required, parents/carers are asked to make an additional meeting time. This opportunity allows for students, parents/carers and teachers to meet and continue the partnership that will produce the best possible learning environment for your child and to celebrate their achievements. Bookings are available via the Compass App. We look forward to the opportunity to meet with families.
