

Sydney Royal Easter Show

A fantastic five days was had, by sixteen Year 5 and 6 students along with Mrs McGoldrick, Mrs Wright and a fun and supportive group of parents.

Students traveled to Mrs McGoldrick's farm on the first Wednesday of the school holidays and spent the day preparing the sheep for the Sydney Royal Easter Show. This involved carding the wool, clipping the bodies of the sheep with hand shears, clipping heads and legs of the sheep, spraying the animals to give them an overall tan, plus packing up all the required equipment needed for the sheep.

Students worked hard, along with their parents and we were finished before dark.

On Thursday, everyone met at Mrs McGoldrick's farm and left from here to travel to the Sydney Show. We stopped for lunch at the Mudgee Bakery and then again at McDonald's before entry into the Showground. We arrived at the Showground around 7pm and all hands were on deck with the unloading of sheep and equipment. Phoebe and Kylie Toynton had put the straw and containers into the pens, this was a huge help.

After unloading and spraying a few more sheep heads, we arrived at the Arena Hotel, our accommodation for the next 5 days.

Friday saw our students competing in the Schools Classes and Paraders Competition.
