A-2 OF ENDANGERED ANIMALS WITH YEAR 3



Year 3 have been learning about the world's endangered animals in English. We have read a fantastic book by Jennifer Cossins which highlights these animals in alphabetical format. In reading groups, we have chosen an Australian endangered animal and we are collecting plenty of background knowledge ready to write an informative text on our chosen animals. We also researched and read about the wonderful work that bees do for our environment and presented our findings in a beautifully illustrated poster. Year 3 have been discussing ways that they can fundraise at school to help raise funds for their endangered animal.

- A IS FOR AMUR TIGER There are believed to be only 540 Amur Tigers left in the wild (Arianah).
- B IS FOR BLUE WHALE The Blue Whale is the largest mammal in the world (Callen).
- D IS FOR DUGONG Dugongs are sometimes called sea cows because they eat sea grass (Emily).
- E- IS FOR EASTERN GORILLA The scientific name for the Eastern Gorilla is Gorilla beringei (Emma).
- f IS FOR FIJIAN IGUANA Fijian Iguanas are herbivores and they eat plants and occasionally insects (Sophie).
- H IS FOR HELMETED HORNBILL The Helmeted Hornbills are classed as critically endangered (Henley).
- J-IS FOR JOCOTOCO ANTRITTA The Jocotoco Antpitta was only discovered in 1997 (John).
- 1 IS FOR LEATHERBACK SEA TURTLE An adult Leatherback Turtle weighs approximately 453kg (Loki).
- M IS FOR MANDRILL The red lines running down the middle of a Mandrill's face, are red blood vessels (Max).
- 0 IS FOR ORANGUTAN Did you know Orangutans have an arm span of about 2.2 metres (Alba)?
- P IS FOR PYGMY THREE-TOED SLOTH Did you know the Pygmy Three-Toed Sloth is as long as 53cm (Mick)?
- Q IS FOR QUOKKA Quokka selfies has led them to be known as the happiest animal in the the world (Bronte).
- R IS FOR RED PANDA Did you know there are only 2,500 10,000 Red Pandas left in the world (Ruby).
- 5 IS FOR SNOW LEOPARD Snow Leopards eat one domestic sheep, 15 birds and one hare a day (Huntah).
- 1 IS FOR TASMANIAN TIGER Devil Facial Tumour Disease is a disease impacting on devil numbers (Matilda).


Join us for our end of Term 2 class performances, Personal Best Awards and our Cancer Council Biggest Morning tea.


