YARNING CIRCLES


Jarvis Watton - AEO ~ Aboriginal Education Officer

Yaama! (Hello/Welcome) My name is Jarvis Watton and I am the Aboriginal Education Officer here at St Lawrence's Primary School. Part of my role as an AEO is to facilitate weekly 'Yarning Circles' with our students. Yarning Circles are designed to be a safe space for students to have their say, without the fear of judgement. Yarning Circles are an informal conversation that is culturally friendly and are recognised by Aboriginal communities as a way to provide and receive information.

We use our Yarning Circles at St Lawrence's to also teach our students about our First Nations Peoples and to raise awareness in our students as to why it is important we recognise and respect First Nations Peoples in Australia. I would like to personally thank the staff and students of St Lawrence's for approaching this ancient practice with respect and for being so open to learning new concepts and belief systems. I look forward to continuing this practice in the future.

Year 2 Cooinda Visit








Last week Year 2 visited Cooinda


