

Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza-Scone Agricultural Excursion Year 5 and 6 26th-29th October, 2023

What a great excursion for our students! We had four very packed, fun filled days at the Scone Steer Show.

On Thursday 26th October 15 students, 17 parents and myself left for Scone with cattle, camper-trailers, truck and equipment.



Once we got to Scone a camping site was created while others unloaded cattle and prepared sawdust beds, feed and equipment at the cattle shed. By 5.30pm, in the rain, we were exhausted so we retired to the RSL for dinner.



That night some camped in the St Mary's Hall at Scone while other families camped on the grounds. Friday 27th October was an educational day for our students and they gained very valuable information from the instructors.





